

NINA WEST (he/him)

NINA WEST – an actor, singer/songwriter, producer, author, host, and activist who won the title of Miss Congeniality on the 11th season of RuPaul's Drag Race and featured on RuPaul's Drag Race: All Stars 9

Nina West rose to international acclaim in 2019 on season 11 of VH1's hit show *RuPaul's Drag Race*, placing sixth and receiving the coveted title of Miss Congeniality. She returned to the show in 2021 as a guest and was anointed "America's Sweetheart" by RuPaul. Nina made history at the 71st Primetime Emmy Awards in September 2019 as the first person to walk the carpet in full drag, in support of her season; that year, *RuPaul's Drag Race* won five Primetime Emmy Awards, including Best Reality Competition Show

In the world of music, Nina has released three EPs: *John Goodman*, a musical comedy EP, which reached no. 2 on the Billboard Comedy

Charts; *Drag Is Magic*, a children's music album, which reached no. 9 on the Billboard Children's Charts; and *The West Christmas Ever*, featuring Disney legend Jim Cummings, which debuted at no. 5 on the Billboard Comedy Charts. She has also released a handful of singles along the way including acclaimed Halloween favorites *Slayer* featuring Taran Killam and *Lisa Frankenstein* featuring Bobby Moynihan.

And Nina is no stranger to the worlds of television and film, having partnered with Nickelodeon and Blue's Clues for a series of Pride videos—Blue's Clues Pride Parade Sing-Along and The Meaning of Pride. She also has voiced characters on animated shows including Baby Shark's Big Show (NICK JR), The Bravest Knight (HULU), Bobby Moynihan's Loafy (COMEDY CENTRAL), and the voice of "Mom" for the animated short Coaster, which was shortlisted for a 2020 Academy Award. Other credits include RuPaul's Secret Celebrity Drag Race, Dragging the Classics: The Brady Bunch for Paramount+ where she portrayed Alice, the Neil Patrick Harris/David Burtka reality show Drag Me To Dinner (HULU), the Lady Camden documentary Lady Like, and her feature film debut as drag legend Divine in 2022's Emmywinning Weird: The Al Yankovic Story. Nina is also one of the subjects of the 2017 documentary Kings, Queens, and In-Betweens.

Nina has proudly partnered with **Disney**, hosting the Disney+ special in 2020 *This Is Me: Pride Celebration Spectacular*, a celebration of the LGBTQ+ community with Disney classics reinterpreted by LGBTQ+ artists like Hayley Kiyoko, Todrick Hall, and Alex Newell. During this pride special, she had the distinct honor of performing with Kermit the Frog where they sang "Rainbow Connection." She returned again in 2021 for the *Say It With Pride: Disney+ Celebrates Pride 365* special, performing with the legendary composer and pianist Alan Menken.

But the stage is where Nina feels most at home. For two seasons (2021-2023), Nina toured the nation as Edna Turnblad in the 20th anniversary Broadway production of *Hairspray*. Other favorite stage credits include the regional premiers of *Buyer and Cellar* (Alex Moore) and *Peter and the Starcatcher* (Betty Bumbrake), both for CATCO, as well as Disney's *The Little Mermaid*, where she portrayed her favorite villain, Ursula. Most recently, she just wrapped a production of *Into The Woods*, portraying The Witch. As a touring artist, she has proudly written, produced, and performed shows for Provincetown, GayDays, and toured with Broadway icon and legend **Seth Rudetsky**.

Nina's used all of the skills that she acquired over her career to become a highly sought-after host for events and shows across the globe. Her event hosting has taken her to Comic-Con, where in 2022, she cohosted the HerUniverse Fashion Show with her super hypefriend, Ashley Eckstein. She is also a favorite at D23 Expo, where she has hosted Mousequerade and a very special 30th anniversary celebration of *The Muppet Christmas Carol* that included an all-star panel of guests including Brian Henson, Dave Goelz, Paul Williams, Polly Smith, and the Muppets, among other panels and events. Nina has also hosted events for Disney Vacation Club and Disney Cruiseline, Proctor and Gamble, Paramount, among others. In 2024, Nina had the distinct honor of hosting the 74th Annual ACE Eddie Awards, honoring the best in television and film editing for the year, where she performed the original piece, Editor! The Musical.

Charity is a major part of who Nina West is, and in 2012, she created **The Nina West Foundation**, which is housed at The Columbus Foundation. Throughout her career, she has worked to amplify and uplift

LGBTQIA+ voices, issues surrounding mental health, and healthcare access—and with the help of people in her hometown of Columbus. Ohio and around the world, raised over \$3 million dollars for various organizations. She has partnered with incredible organizations like The Trevor Project, Family Equality, Bring Change 2 Mind, Kids Mental Health Foundation, Planned Parenthood, Kaleidoscope Youth Center, Sage, The Ali Fornay Center, Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS, and many more. One of her favorite projects to date was partnering with the queen of country music, **Dolly Parton** for the "Kindness is Queen" campaign to raise money for both the Nina West Foundation and Dolly Parton's Imagination Library in 2020.

In 2022, Nina's first children's book The You Kind of Kind was published to critical acclaim. It was illustrated by her friend, artist Hayden Evans.

In May 2024, Nina received an honorary Doctorate of Fine Arts from Columbus College of Art and Design. Andrew is a graduate of Denison University.

Spencer Zembrodt Artistic Director, Cincinnati Men's Chorus

Spencer Zembrodt is a dynamic conductor, composer, and educator, currently serving as the Artistic Director of the Cincinnati Men's Chorus. He is a passionate community builder and advocate for the arts and LGBTQ+ rights in Cincinnati and beyond.

As an active performer, Spencer has played with notable groups, including the Springfield Symphony Orchestra, the Cincinnati Boychoir, and in numerous musical theatre productions. Alongside his performing endeavors, Spencer helps train the next generation of musicians as a

piano teacher. His passion for teaching has also extended to appearances as a guest faculty member at the Universal Artists Festival and guest conductor of the Southeast Indiana Youth Orchestra.

Spencer has an extensive musical background, having held positions as Assistant Conductor for the Shippensburg Symphony Festival and the Orchard Park Symphony Orchestra. His compositions and arrangements have been performed by high school, university, community, and professional ensembles. Spencer holds bachelor's and master's degrees in music from the University of Louisville and the State University of New York at Fredonia, respectively.



Mark Johnson Assistant Conductor, Cincinnati Men's Chorus

Mark Johnson is a musician by vocation and avocation. He serves as a musician for Gaines United Methodist Church in Madisonville, where he was the minister of music for many years. As an avocation, Mark has sung with the Cincinnati Men's Chorus since its inaugural season and been in one of its small ensembles every year since then.

Mark was in the first class to graduate from Cincinnati's School for the Creative and Performing Arts, where he appeared in musicals and operettas. He then attended Butler University, where he sang and received a bachelor of arts in arts administration. He has sung in the May Festival Chorus. With CMC and its small ensembles, Mark has performed with

the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, the Cincinnati Pops and the May Festival Chorus. He also has appeared with CMC and its small ensembles in Berea, Ky.; Columbus; Dayton; Cleveland; Lexington, Ky.; London, Ohio; Louisville; and Indianapolis, as well as at choral music festivals in Chicago; Denver; Miami; Minneapolis; Montreal; Muncie, Ind.; and San Jose, Calif. plus the World Choir Games held here in Cincinnati.

Mark also serves as the leader of CMC's first tenor section and is a former CMC president and board member. He works as a store construction/remodeling supervisor for Kroger. He is honored to take the podium as CMC's assistant conductor.



Dasom Kwon Principal Pianist, Cincinnati Men's Chorus

Dr. Dasom Kwon, a native of South Korea, is a sought after pianist and collaborator. She earned her Doctor of Musical Arts degree from The Ohio State University, where she served as a Graduate Teaching Associate, receiving three consecutive Graduate Teaching Associate awards in recognition of her exceptional teaching and performances. Previously, Dr. Kwon completed dual master's degrees in piano performance and collaborative piano at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, where she was honored with the Graduate Assistantship Scholarship and the Artman Straub Scholarship.

Dr. Kwon currently works at Xavier University and Northern Kentucky University as a collaborative pianist. She has previously worked as a pianist and opera coach for the Indianapolis Opera Company; and at the Interlochen Arts Camp, inspiring emerging artists and fostering a love for music. She is delighted to serve as the pianist for the Cincinnati Men's Chorus.



Jeffrey Johnson 69

Interpreter for the Deaf, Cincinnati Men's Chorus

Jeffrey Johnson brings the music of Cincinnati Men's Chorus to the Deaf and Hard of Hearing through American Sign Language and has been working as an interpreter since 1989. A nationally certified interpreter, Jeffrey holds a Bachelor of Science in Special Education-Interpreting from The University of Cincinnati and completed the TDF Interpreting for The Theatre program in NYC. He retired from HCESC as a full-time educational interpreter and currently works as a freelance interpreter.

Jeffrey's true passion is interpreting for Theatre, Music and Arts, which he has done for the past 25+ years. A few of his favorite shows: Hair; RENT; Tick, Tick,... Boom!; Avenue Q; Angels In America; and Corpus Christi. He is excited to continue working with the Cincinnati Men's Chorus. Richard Cole

Artistic Director, North Coast Men's Chorus

Richard Cole has served as the Artistic Director for the North Coast Men's Chorus since the second half of the 1997/98 season. He joined the chorus as a singer in 1989 and got actively involved from the beginning by serving on the Board for several years. In addition to the full chorus, Rich also directs The Coastliners, NCMC's small ensemble. Rich was the Chair for the wildly successful Band and Choral events for the 2014 Gay Games hosted in Cleveland. In 2015, Rich was the recipient of an LGBT Heritage Day award by the City of Cleveland for his contributions to entertainment in the city.

NCMC has flourished under his leadership and guidance. In addition to annual increases in attendance at our concerts and growth in membership, his enthusiasm, energy and creativity have been the driving force responsible for bringing guest artists in to perform with the chorus, including Brian Stokes Mitchell, Michael Feinstein, Maureen McGovern, Leslie Jordan, Armistead Maupin and Bernadette Peters.

Rich graduated from Bowling Green State University in 1981 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in music education and frequently arranges and/or transcribes pieces of music for the Chorus.



Robert Day Principal Accompanist, North Coast Men's Chorus

Robert Day began his tenure as NCMC's Principal Accompanist in the June 2000 "Touching Hearts, Changing Lives" concerts. Since then, he has accompanied the chorus in all concerts, NCMC benefits, at six GALA Chorus Festivals, and on their five CDs.

A native Clevelander, Bob holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Otterbein University, and a Master of Music degree in Organ Performance from The Ohio State University. Bob is retired from 30 years of public school teaching in choral music, but still serves as Organist at The Church of the Saviour in Cleveland Heights.

ASL Interpreter, North Coast Men's Chorus

Doug Braun has been part of the NCMC since its beginning. Braun graduated from Oberlin College and received his sign language training at Cleveland State University. Braun earned his Master's Degree in Social Work in 1991. He provides in-home counseling for Cleveland elders. A ham radio operator for twenty years, he volunteers with the Amateur Radio Emergency Services.



Gregory Daniels Choreographer, North Coast Men's Chorus

Gregory Daniels has been the head of the Dance Program at Baldwin Wallace University for 14 years. As a professional dancer, Greg has performed in regional theaters from coast to coast, in national and international tours of Broadway shows and, for nine years in the Radio City Christmas Spectacular in NYC. He teaches master classes across the country. His choreographic credits include Anything Goes, starring Tony Award nominated Dee Hoty; the world premiere of a new musical, My Own Song (Flatrock Playhouse, NC), starring Clint Holmes; and Putting it Together (Syracuse Stage), starring Tony Award winners Lillias White and

Chuck Cooper. Other shows, to name a few, include Cabaret, Les Miserables, The Secret Garden and Forever Plaid (Idaho Shakespeare Festival and Great Lakes Theater), Dreamgirls and Smokey Joe's Cafe (Cain Park), and the regional premiere of Spring Awakening, Carrie: the musical and Once (Beck Center for the Arts). Greg also had the rare honor of creating an original number for the World Famous Rockettes at New York's famed Radio City Music Hall for the Commerce Bank WOW Awards. For Baldwin Wallace University, he has choreographed such shows as Rent, La Bohème, Lizzie: The Musical, Follies, A Chorus Line, the academic premiere of Kinky Boots and the first academic production of Spring Awakening that streamed around the world, including an encore weekend because of the demand. Awards include 2012 and 2014 Cleveland Critics Circle Award for Best Choreographer for the regional premiere of Spring Awakening and Carrie, and 2012 and 2014 Broadwayworld.com Cleveland Award for Best Choreography for Sondheim on Sondheim, Carrie and Les Miserables. My Friend." Kathy has worked along side great song stylists like Margaret Whiting, Julie Wilson, and Sally Mays to name a few.



Raymonde Rougier Accompanist, Dayton Gay Men's Chorus

Raymonde Rougier graduated from Eastern Kentucky University; came home and taught music in the Kettering Schools for 30 years. She retired in 2000. Since retiring, she has filled her time with all sorts of musical activities in the Dayton area. She accompanied the Dayton Liederkranz chorus for 18 years, has played for several area high school choirs and high school musical productions. She has played piano and organ in church and directed choirs in Beavercreek for 25 years. She accumulated almost 5000 hours of volunteer time for the City of Kettering volunteer program, directing the Kettering Senior Show Choir and the Joyful Musicians for the Lathrem Center in Kettering. She accumulated over 5000 hours at

Woodland Altars and the Southern Ohio Outdoor Ministries program, directing a summer musical for teenagers for 26 years. She currently serves in an adjunct pianist position at Wright State University. She is part of two Halls of Fame for the Kettering Schools: the general hall of fame and the inaugural 2021 Performing Arts Hall of Fame. She has accompanied the DGMC for 20 years and loves every minute of it.

COLUMBUS GAY MEN'S CHORUS



Jared Brayton Bollenbacher, MM, MSW, LICSW (he/him/his) Artistic Director

After leaving his dairy farm upbringing in his home state of Indiana, Brayton received a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance from The Ohio State University in 2006 and a Bachelor of Arts in sexualities studies in 2007, completing a thesis on How Gay Male Bias Influences the Gender Performance of Drag Queens in and out of Drag. After spending six amazing years in Columbus, Brayton completed his Master of Social Work at the University of Washington in Seattle in 2010, and received his Licensed Independent Clinical Social Work credentials in 2014.

After graduating in 2010, Brayton spent six years as the artistic director of Diverse Harmony, the nation's first queer straight alliance youth chorus, and Diverse Harmony's small a cappella ensemble Spectrum. Brayton left Seattle in 2017 to become the artistic director of Reveille Men's Chorus and Desert Voices Chorus in Tucson, AZ. Brayton completed his Master of Choral Conducting in 2020 from the University of Arizona. In 2022, Brayton spent six months as interim with NYCGMC in order to get the organization back on their feet during a difficult time. Brayton is very focused on community choral organizations. In 2019 he served on the board of the Arizona ACDA and is currently in his fourth year on the board for GALA Choruses and serves as the committee chair for the Member and Education and Networking committee. 




